Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, equipment, and materials and performing all work for Project F-095-2(2), Front Street, Grant Street to Mission Street, Ketchikan, described herein, will be received until 11:00 a.m. Prevaling Time, May 28, 1968, in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project consists of grading, drainage and concrete paving of 0.13 miles of Front Street in Ketchikan and construction of a 296 foot reinforced concrete viaduct. Principal items of work will consist of the following: Removal of Structures and Obstructions, all required; Concrete Pavement, 1,900 square yards; Class A Concrete, 550 cubic yards; Reinforcing Steel, 95,000 pounds; Welded Wire Fabric, 19,400 pounds; 32 Prestressed Concrete Beams; 560 linear feet of Aluminum Bridge Rolling; and miscellaneous items of work.
