AFN Receives Training Fund

Kris W. Lethin, director of the Alaska Office Economic Opportunity, writes in his State OEO News that the Alaska Federation of Natives recently received approval for an on-the-job training program.

The Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training of the U.S. Department of Labor has funded the program in the amount of \$282,792.

The federal grant will make it possible for Alaskans, mainly native people, to take training at various locations throughout the State in skills which will better prepare and equip them to work on jobs with airlines, logging companies, cold storage companies, retail establishments, service professions, tug and barge companies, and other such enterprises in Alaska.

Two hundred trainees are expected to enroll and receive on-the-job training for a period of 20 weeks each.

The entire program will last 18 months.

Ingraham to Coordinate Brandley Race

Kent Brandley, candidate for the State House of Representatives from this district, said this week that attorney Millard Ingraham has agreed to be his campaign coordinator.

Ingraham, 34, has been active in Democratic party in Alaska for many years. Ingraham is married and has lived in Fairbanks for seven years.

Ingraham said he hoped that many small campaign contributions would come in to aid Brandley. He said "Friends to Elect Kent Brandley to the House of Representatives" would be receiving mail at PO Box 1364 in Fairbanks.

In other developments, Ingraham called the first in a series of private brainstorming sessions of Brandley's supporters and said position papers and campaign strategy would be derived from this group of young brain trusters.

Ingraham said Brandley would travel to bush villages with other candidates, local and statewide, exchanging transportation for help with publicity releases. Brandley is a newsmen and a free-lance writer.

Drum Dancers in Dance Training

The MacKenzie Delta Drum Dancers of Inuvik, N.W.T. in Canada will again be at the World Eskimo Olympics in Fairbanks on August 8-9-10.

Mrs. Ollie Anderson, a member of the Eskimo Olympics Committee, was up to Inuvik not long ago and had a meeting with the Drum Dancers during which she was told that the Inuvik performers will again attend as they did last year.

"They're planning to rehearse new dances—very old traditional dances for the Olympics," Mrs. Anderson told the Tundra Times. "They're out to get Barrow this year."

Barrow Eskimo dancers last year captured the title of the best dancers in that category and the Inuvik Drum Dancers placed close second.

The Inuvik group gave its Alaskan counterparts stiff and exciting competition in several events last August and their performances were very well received by the audiences.

Mrs. Anderson said that the group will bring ten dancers, one man who will compete in hi-kicking, ear pulling and other events.

Inuvik has already picked a native queen to represent the area and Ollie Anderson said she was Miss Roseanne Allen—but she wasn't quite sure.

If Miss Allen had been picked, she is the title holder of the Canadian Junior Cross-Country Ski Championship held last February at Port Arthur.

Other communities in the Canadian North have expressed interest in participating in the Eskimo Olympics.

A delegation is coming from the City of Calgary, Alberta led by the mayor of that city.

The Eskimo Olympics will be held in the beautiful and spacious gold-domed Seward Hall at Alakaland or last year's centennial celebration grounds.

One of Elim's most handsome bachelors is wearing the track of his Skidoo running up to Koyuk.

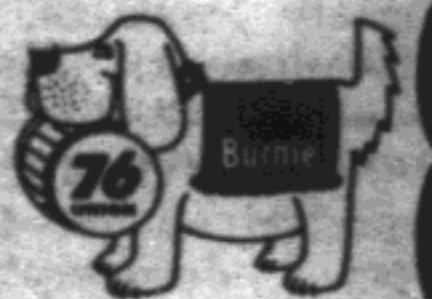
