Alaskans wanting summer jobs with the federal government should apply before Dec. 8, reports Senator Ernest Gruening.

Persons who have reached age 18, or who are at least 16 years old and have graduated from high school, may obtain an application card from college placement offices, most post offices, Inter-agency Boards of Examiners, and the U. S. Civil Service Commission.

The Lummi Indians of Marietta, Washington have started to teach their children the native language that had been in the process of disappearing through the years in the past.

The editor of the Tundra Times wrote the editorial, "THE ILLNESS AND THE CURE," last July after reading that the Lummis had started a class in an effort to perpetuate and re-establish their own language.
