Bartlett Criticizes Federal Agencies For Large Land Withdrawals

WASHINGTON-Senator E.L. Bartlett criticized federal agencies for largewithdrawal of lands scale the public domain. In a statement explaining

why he cosponsored a bill to require congressional approval of any withdrawal of public acres by the Federal Government, Bartlett noted that federal departments "have a tendency to take far more land from the public domain than they actually require."

"It would be in the public interest to have these departments come to Congress for any large withdrawals. Time after time we have discovered withdrawals have needs, and once withdrawn, All interested persons should it is difficult to get the land to the public returned domain," Bartlett said.

> The 'proposed legislation would broaden the Defense

Withdrawal Act to include a 5,000-acre limitation on all federal agencies, rather than just on the Department of Defense.

The need for such a bill, said, was highlighted by the recent action of Department of the Interior in issuing its geothwithdrawing order. This order, since modified, would have withdrawn in one stroke all lands which the department believed to be valuable, either presently or prospectively, for geothermal steam.

Interior Department witness es admitted that this might amount to more than million acres.

The present bill is similar to one introduced by Senator Bartlett and passed by the Senate in 1960, but not acted upon by the Interior and Insular Affairs Comm ittee in the House.

Previous attempts to get land withdrawal limitation bills passed have encountered opposition from the Interior and Agriculture Departments.

Sea otter pelts will be sold for the first time since 1911 from Atka under supervision next Jan. 30 at the Seattle Fur Exchange.

Ed Shepherd of Anchorage has been named by Governor Walter J. Hickel to oversee the sale of 1,000 pelts. estimetes they will sell for \$1,800 to \$2,700 each.

Sea otters were hunted to ne ar extinction until 1911 when by a protection treaty between the United States, Canada, Russia and Japan. The pelts will be

this fall by Aleut hunters of the Department of Fish and Game. Under the 1911 treaty sea otter could not be taken either within or beyond the three mile limit of Alaska coastal waters.
