

Hickel Signs Land Claims Measure

Governor Walter J. Hickel signed the State Native Land Claims bill this week in Juneau.

When implemented, the bill will provide a minimum settlement of \$50 million to native groups and it will be administered by a native corporation.

The bill will become effective only when Congress enacts a land claims settlement in Alaska and after the land freeze is lifted by the Department of the Interior.

The bill was drafted through the cooperative efforts of the Native Lands Claims Task Force, the State and the Department of the Interior.

The Task Force was led by Rep. Willie Hensley of Kotzebue with the legal counsel provided by Barry Jackson of Fairbanks, Cliff Groh of Anchorage and Roger Connor of Juneau.

Atty. Gen. Edgar P. Boyko furnished the largest share

of work for the Governor and the State. Robert Vaughan, deputy secretary for the Department of the Interior furnished the work for that department.

Gov. Hickel called the

Gallagher Joins Bartlett Staff As Administrative Assistant

WASHINGTON — Hugh G. Gallagher, 35, will join the staff of Senator E. L. Bartlett May 6 as administrative

assistant, the senator announced this week.

Gallagher takes over the position held by Miss Mary Lee Council since 1945 when Bartlett came to Washington as Territorial Delegate. Miss Council retired from the post last July 1.

Gallagher served as a legislative assistant to Bartlett between January 1963 and December 1966.

After leaving Bartlett's office, Gallagher was awarded a Congressional Staff Fellowship by the American Political Science Association to write a book on the Senate
