"If we do not act now, for

years to come we will be told: See. We offered Indians the opportunity to be heard, to shape their own destiny, to control their own affairs. They just aren't ready yet. They just don't want self-determination," MacDonald warned.

"We have never had more opportunity for Indian spokesmen to be heard and listened to--by the Administration, by Congress. even by state and local officials. We have never had a better opportunity to stand on our own two feet and speak out for people ... But ironically. Indian organizations have never been in worse shape.


Navajo Nation Chairman McDonald Urges Self Determination
