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Savoonga Walrus Freezer Gets Grant

An experimental unit to store walrus meat during the summer will be built in Savoonga through a \$25,000 grant from the Institute of Arctic Environmental Engineering of the University of Alaska.

The project is the third stage of a demonstration project which has taken three years of intensive research. The system utilizes an underground brine pool and natural winter cold. Announcement of the grant

came from the office of Sen. Mike Gravel. It is estimated the Savoonga system could save \$78,000 worth of walrus meat a year and that a system of coolers throughout the state could save more than \$3 million in meat and fish.
