

## Frank Peratrovich, Jr. Selected for Indian Administrator Program

BIA employee, Frank Peratrovich, age 33, was one of two people recently selected from 35 nation-wide applicants to enter a 3-year Indian Administrator Program in Washington, D.C.

This training program is designed to develop Personnel Administrators through on-the-job experience in the Washington office. In addition, the trainees will take college courses, and have work-details in Area and Agency offices.

Participants are trained to assume the responsibilities of Superintendents, Area Directors, and Assistant Commissioners.

Prior to accepting the training appointment, Frank was an Employment Assistance Specialist with the BIA in Fairbanks. Previous experience includes the job of Acting Director of Minority Hire for the State Labor Department.

He attended school in Juneau through the 11th grade, then his family moved to Andarko, Oklahoma, where he completed his high school education. Following high school he entered the Marine Corps for 2 years.

Upon returning from service he attended Junior College in Bremerton, Washington, and the University of Alaska for one

year.

While in Alaska Frank was a member of the Fairbanks Native Association and the Human Rights Commission. He is married to the former Nettie McCloud of Craig, and they have a son, 7 years old.

The family will live in Washington, D.C. while Frank completes his management training.

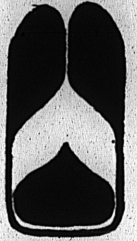
