in September of 1969 in recognition for his efforts on behalf of Alaska Natives.

Rep. Begich said Mr. Notti would travel throughout Alaska on his behalf to solicit Native opinion. He will also represent the congressman on matters concerning Natives.

The appointment is one of the first actions taken by Rep. Begich following the opening of his Washington office in suite 1210 of the House of Representatives' Longworth Office Building.

The addition of Mr. Notti to his staff was described as part of Rep. Begich's effort to attack his "number one problem" of achieving a fair settlement of the Alaska Native Land Claims.

The congressman said passage of the claims bill would be a "long overdue action to recognize the needs of a great rural people."

He stated that the claims must be settled "for the sake of improving the life style of a great people...and for the economy of the state."

He indicated that his efforts in Washington will reflect his concern for three problem areas stressed during his election campaign.

Primarily, he wants a fair land claims settlement as well as programs to meet educational, health and sanitation needs in rural Alaska.

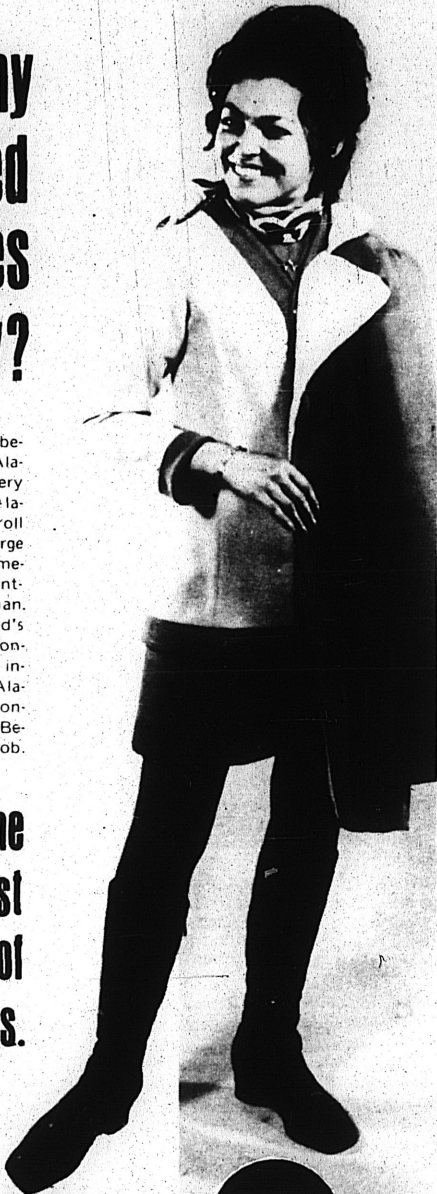
