Miss Marty Tetzlaff, Chairman of the Fort Yukon Residents' Council announced in Ft. Yukon that the Residents' Council of the Fort Yukon Commun-ity Facility has established a goal of \$30,000 for equipment for the new Community Facility. The Community Facility is

presently under construction in Fort Yukon and is funded by the Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Department of Education of the State Alaska and the Episcopal of Alas Church.

The Facility will be owned and operated by the City of Fort Yukon. It will house a number of multi-service units and will make available for the first time in a remote Alaskan willbase, applied by a property of the control village a public laundromat, shower rooms, conference and meeting rooms and two multi-purpose recreation and education rooms.

The building will make possible a broad range of health; education, welfare and other social service programs.

Although runds for construc-tion are assured, the facility will be useless unless additional funds can be raised," Miss Tetz-laff said. "In order for us to adequately equip the building so that we can operate efficientwe estimate that we need \$30,000.00."
