Hydaburg Fish Works Again in Production

The fish processing industry is producing again in Hydaburg for the first time in four years according to Commissioner of Economic Development, Frank Murkowski.

Shoshoni Incorporated of Boise, Idaho is operating the Hydaburg Co-op cannery which has lain idle since 1965.

Shoshoni will lease the plant for one year with option to buy. The company will employ local residents in the processing jobs. Shoshoni has purchased salmon roe from many Alaskan cold storage plants since 1966.

A diversified operation is planned with eventual processing of shrimp, caviar, crab, clams, fish bait and possibly sea cucumbers and nori kelp.

The cannery was originally financed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs working through the Hydaburg Cooperative Association. Continuing operation of the plant has been an objective of the Hydaburg community, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Department of Economic Development and Presbyterian Church of Alaska.

the Escondido Mutual Water Co. to the city of Escondido. A hearing has been set for the

August 15, 1969 at 2:00 p.m. in Federal Court.

The Order was sought and obtained by attorneys for California Indian Legal Services who represent the Rincon and La Jolla Bands of Mission Indians in a multi-million dollar claim against the Escondido Mutual Water Company.

The Indians have filed a lawsuit charging the Mutual Water Company with taking their water for the past 75 years without having paid for any of it.

"The Order was necessary," said Robert S. Pelcyger, attorney for the Indians, "because counsel for the City of Esocndido has stated that the City was not assuming liability for the past acts of the Mutual Water Company. Obviously, the acquisition of the Mutual Water Company under such circumstances would make it more difficult for the Indians to satisfy the judgment to which they may be entitled."
