Commenting on his proposal contained in letters sent to Governor Hickel and several federal agencies Rader said, "This program would teach skills required in all phases of oil production. It would include construction, drilling, pumping, pipeline work and all related support operations."

"We have the students...we have the schools," Rader said. "The Cook Inlet Basin could serve as a training ground in oil production for the unemployed of the North Slope areas. When training is completed, the oil producers of the North Slope will have a skilled work force to provide permanent, stable support because these Alaskans are acclimated to the rigors of the environment."

Experienced Legislators Needed in Washington

Ted Stevens, Republican candidate for the U. S. Senate, speaking before the Anchorage Kiwanis Club, has emphasized the need for experienced legislators in the U. S. Senate, representing Alaska.

"The Congress of the United States is 50 years behind the State Legislature in modernizing their techniques. Those of us who have served in the Alaska legislature have worked hard to

modernize our procedures. Congress must do the same thing—in the Senate, for instance, it takes 48 minutes to call the roll on any vote. Congress must adapt itself to the computer age—it must have new people, but a Senator for the Seventies must be an experienced legislator who has already learned how to deal with the legislative process."

Stevens again criticized his primary opponent for failing to stand up and face the issues, personally, in an "unrehearsed, free and open debate." "I fail to see," Stevens said, "how the voters can judge a man's ability to speak for Alaska on issues of the day in open debate on the floor of the U. S. Senate if he is unwilling to debate right here at home."

lation is going to consider each tribe accordingly.

"Why?" he continued. "Because, where do I read but in the congressional record—the daily recorded proceedings of the United States Congress—that on May 6, 1968, on page H3335, the House passed a bill called, 'Authorizing the use of funds arising from the judgment in favor of the Spokane tribe of Indians.'

"That on the same page and the same day, a bill was passed 'Authorizing the purchase, sale and exchange of certain lands of the Spokane Indian reservation,' that on page H3336 on the same day, another bill was passed, 'Granting minerals including oil and gas on certain lands in the Crow Indian reservation, Montana, and for other purposes.'

"Again on the same day, a bill was passed "Granting minerals including oil and gas

and other deposits on certain lands in the Northern Cheyenne Indian reservation," to certain Indians.

"That on page H3345 on the same day, an act was passed amending the Act of March 1, 1933 entitled, 'An Act to permanently set aside certain lands in Utah as an addition to the Navajo Indian reservation.'

"And again on the same page and day, a bill was passed, 'conveying certain federally owned lands to the Cheyenne and the Arapaho Tribes of Oklahoma.'

"My friends, the Alaska natives are not going to get a package settlement. Each tribe has to be considered for settlement on their own merit and unless we change step now and start legislation rolling in for each tribe, there is no immediate solution in sight," stated Eben Hopson.
