G.I. Home Loan Deadline Set for World War II Vets

The cutoff date for the World War II G.I. Home Loan Program is July 25, H.C. Christie, manager Admin-Juneau Veterans Office, istration Regional said this week.

It affects applications for guaranteed or insured G.I. home loans for veterans of World War II.

Veterans of the Korean Conflict and of the Viet-Nam era are not affected by the World War II cutoff date. Conflict For Korean veterans, the deadline is Jan. 31, 1975.

For post-Korean Conflict veterans the loan deadline formula is the same as the one for previous programs. It is 10 years after the date of discharge, plus one year for each three months active duty, but not in excess of 20 years from date of last discharge.


