## Mutual Self-Help Home Loan Approved for Hoonah

Senator Ernest Gruening announced approval of a \$187,670 loan by the Housing and Urban Development

Department for construction of 15 mutual and self-help homes at Hoonah. Average cost per home is an estimated \$12,165.

Project head is Edward B. Crittenden, of the Alaska State Housing Authority. The project contemplates eventual ownership by residents. Federal loans are to be refinanced by sale of local authority notes to private industry.

### Deadline Set for World War II Vets

The cutoff date for the World War II G.I. Home Loan Program is July 25, H.C. Christie, manager of the Juneau Veterans Administration Regional Office, said this week.

It affects applications for VA guaranteed or insured G.I. home loans for veterans of World War II.

Veterans of the Korean Conflict and of the Viet-Nam era are not affected by the World War II cutoff date. For Korean Conflict veterans, the deadline is Jan. 31, 1975.

For post-Korean Conflict veterans the loan deadline formula is the same as the one for previous programs. It is 10 years after the date of discharge, plus one year for each three months active duty, but not in excess of 20 years from date of last discharge.

## U of A Trains Villagers for Sawmill Work

Residents of four interior Alaskan villages have received special training courses through the University of Alaska to prepare them to operate sawmills established in their areas by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The one-week course was offered by the university's Department of Summer Sessions, Conferences and Short Courses at Minto, Noorvik, Lower Kalskag and Shageluk during May and June.

Richard Lewis of Auke Bay was the instructor for the course.

The course was a cooperative effort, offered by the university in cooperation with the Alaska Forest Service, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the U.S. Forest Service and the State Division of Vocational Education.

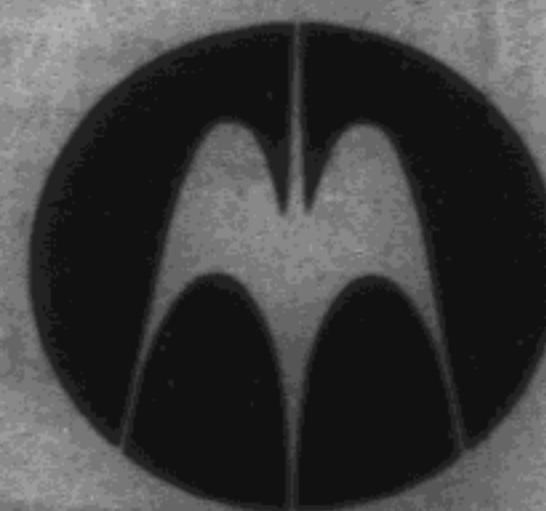
