

State Awards Two Contracts for Yakutat, Nenana School Facilities

JUNEAU — The state has awarded two contracts totaling \$1.7 million for construction of a new elementary and secondary at Yakutat and the addition of a 15,000 square foot multipurpose room at Nenana school, Governor William A. Egan said today.

A \$1,044,800 contract for the 15,750 square foot school building at Yakutat was awarded by the Department of Public Works to Steward & Co., Anchorage, and a \$692,977 contract for the Nenana addition to L. B. Anderson Construction, Inc., Anchorage.

The new wood and steel frame structure at Yakutat will house an instructional materials center, seven teaching areas and a multipurpose room. Completion is scheduled for the end of November.

The wood frame multipurpose building at Nenana is to be completed by mid-December and will house a gymnasium with lockers and showers, a vocational training shop, nurse's room, and kitchen-home economics room.

Minority Business Seminar in N.Y.

The United States Federal Task Force on Procurement for Minority Businessmen will sponsor a Minority Business Opportunity Seminar at the Statler Hilton Hotel in New York City Friday, June 2, John L. Jenkins, Director of the Commerce Department's Office of Minority Business Enterprise (OMBE), announced today.

The seminar, to run from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., will provide information on government purchasing procedures, management and technical assistance, subcontracting, finance, and private sector opportunities.

It will include general sessions workshops and counseling on

Federal minority business development efforts and opportunities.

Agencies sponsoring the seminar include the General Services Administration, Small Business Administration, Department of Defense, Veterans Administration, and OMBE and its affiliated Local Business Development Organizations. Other agencies providing counselors for the seminar are the Department of Transportation; Action; National Aeronautics and Space Administration; Health, Education and Welfare; and the New York Field Office of the Department of Commerce.

Several New York Federal prime contractors will also be on hand to discuss their firms' procurement procedures and potential requirements.

Seminars will be conducted

in 11 other cities this year. The cities and dates are as follows.

Minneapolis, July 6; Detroit, July 20; Kansas City, August 21; San Francisco, August 25; Los Angeles, (to be announced).

Chicago, September 15; San Antonio, September 18; Atlanta, September 22; Miami, September 26; Dallas, October 3; Philadelphia, (to be announced).

The Office of Minority Business Enterprise (OMBE) was established by President Nixon in March of 1969 and placed under the responsibility of the Secretary of Commerce. Serving as the coordinating agency in the President's minority enterprise program OMBE seeks to identify and increase opportunities for members of minority groups to enter into business or expand existing ones.

Senator Gravel Initiates Effort To Get New School for Chevak

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Senator Mike Gravel has initiated an effort in the U.S. Senate to obtain more than \$3.5 million dollars to replace a school in Chevak, Alaska, which was totally destroyed by fire recently.

The Alaska Democrat wrote today to Senator Alan Bible, Chairman of the Senate Interior Appropriations Subcommittee asking that the funds to replace the school be included in the 1973 Fiscal Year Appropriations Bill for the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The Appropriations bill is currently being considered by the Subcommittee.

The Chevak school, operated by the BIA, is used by some 150 students.

The BIA has advised Senator Gravel that a new building should include six classrooms, a kindergarten, library or material center, a health room, guest house, office and shop, an all purpose gymnasium, a kitchen and dining room, a three-bedroom house, a generator building, a storage room, a heater room and heating plant.

In addition, funds will be needed to replace destroyed

equipment and to provide for planning and design.

The BIA estimates the cost for this work at \$3,500,000. Senator Gravel told Senator Bible that the BIA does not have the contingency funds available at this time to meet the emergency.

Senator Gravel said: "It is vital that the Congress make available these funds through the 1973 Fiscal year appropriation."

Senator Gravel said that until a new building is constructed the children of Chevak will receive their instruction in a church and a community building.

He said, however, that the accommodations "are not nearly large enough and the quality of education will decline rapidly."

Senator Gravel concluded his letter to Senator Bible as follows:

"On behalf of the children and parents of Chevak, I urge that you consider appropriating the needed funds as soon as possible so that reconstruction of this needed school can begin."
