

## Nationwide Uniform Fire Call Proposed

Senator Ernest Gruening (D-Alaska) last week introduced a concurrent resolution which would make it possible for a citizen to dial one uniform nationwide fire reporting telephone number and one uniform nationwide police reporting telephone number.

He said on the floor of the Senate, "Uniform nationwide fire reporting and police reporting telephone numbers will not end riots, eradicate criminals, nor prevent fires, but they would provide two sensible tools which could make it possible for a stranger passing through town to save a burning home or apartment house or let local police authorities know that a store front has been broken."
