

AFN Receives \$400,828 Grant

JUNEAU-Governor Keith H. Miller announced last week that a \$400,828 Office of Economic Opportunity grant will be administered by the Alaska Federation of Natives in Anchorage.

The grant is to provide a program, the Bethel Health Cooperative will recruit personnel to conduct a training program for village health aides. Approximately 7,000 people will be served.

The existing prematernal home in Bethel, which houses pregnant patients from three to four weeks prior to delivery, will be the nucleus of the ambulatory unit.

Planning assistance will also be made available for a similar program in the Nome area.

The program will be coordinated with the Alaska Medical Association; the Alaska Department of Health and Welfare, Division of Public Health; the National Medical Program Comprehensive Health Planning; the Alaska Rural Community Action Program; and the Department of Defense.

The information was relayed to Governor Miller by Senator Ted Stevens.


