

## 3,100-Member UA Body Includes Students from 20 Foreign Lands

**FAIRBANKS** — The 3,100-member University of Alaska student body here this year includes students from 20 foreign countries and from all the United States but Delaware and Louisiana.

The Alaska students on campus come from 144 cities, towns and villages in the state.

Records compiled by the Office of the Director of Admissions and Registrar show that 674 students have come from

the other states, 130 of them from California.

New York, represented by 61 students, ranks second, and Washington, by 45, ranks third. Thirty-one students came from Ohio, 30 from Illinois, 28 from Colorado, 25 each from Oregon and Pennsylvania, 24 from Massachusetts, 20 each from Michigan, Texas and Wisconsin, 19 from Minnesota and 16 from Virginia.

A majority of the 85 foreign students — 46 — are from Canada. Eight are from Formosa. Australia, India, Japan and Norway are each represented by three students, and Belgium, Germany, Ethiopia, the Philippines, and Afghanistan by two.

The remainder of the foreign students have come from France, Iran, Israel, Nepal, Malaysia,

Korea, Nigeria, Sweden and Hong Kong.
