Two Venetie youths, Lawrence Roberts and David Henry, were graduated from the GED program at Kicking Horse Regional Residential Manpower Center on November 20.

Henry is the son of Mrs. Elled Henry, also of Venetie. Both young men have been at Kicking Horse since July 18.

The Kicking Horse facility is the only all Indian Job Corps center in the nation. Located at Ronan, Montana, it provides vocational training for 200 Indians, aged 16 to 21 years.

The center is operated by the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes of the Flathead Indian Reservation through a contract with the U.S. Department of Labor.

14 Indian Athletes on Indian Hall of Fame

Fourteen great Indian athletes, five of whom are still living, were formally inducted into the American Indian Athletic Hall of Fame Saturday, Nov. 25.

Louie "Rabbit" Weller, Allie Reynolds, Wilson D. "Buster" Charles and Albert Exendine were present at the inaugural banquet in the Kansas Union.

Deceased honorees John Levi, Charles "Chief" A. Bender, Jim Thorpe, Louis Tewanima, Joseph "Indian Joe" Guyon, John "Chief" Meyers, Alex Arcase and Reuben Sanders were represented by relatives.

Levi, regarded as the greatest athlete in the history of Haskell, Kan., was represented by his son John Jr. Thorpe was represented by his daughter Grace and two sons.

Completing the list of nominees are former Haskell gridders Theodore "Tiny" Roebuck and ex-Carlyle All-American Jimmie Johnson.
