Following these activities, everyone adjourned to the building where the school children presented a program. A tour of the new facilities was made and refreshments were served.

In addition to Mr. Balliet, other visitors from the BIA office in Nome included Mr. Robert Davis, Superintendent, Mr. Fred Muhs, Social Services, and Mr. Monteau, Administrative Manager.

The villagers expressed their thanks for the new construction and to the visitors who traveled to Golovin to participate in the occasion.

Attack Roils Congressman's Supporter

An attack on Congressman Howard W. Pollock, Alaska's single U.S. Representative, by one of Senator E.L. Bartlett's staff members brought a sharp rejoinder last week from State Senator Frank Harris. The aide's remarks were made Thursday in Anchorage at the weekly Democratic luncheon.

"Two years ago the Johnson-Humphrey Administration sent Ernest Gruening to Alaska to do a hatchet job on Howard Pollock," Harris said. "Now Gruening is occupied with other matters so they had to send a third stringer to do the dirty work."

During the 1966 election campaign an attack by Senator Ernest Gruening (D-Alaska) on State Senator Howard Pollock precipitated a walk out of Rep-

GOP Installs Statewide Teletype Network

The Republican Party has installed a statewide teletype system, which ties together Anchorage, Fairbanks, Kodiak, Juneau, Sitka and Ketchikan to facilitate press communications for the Nixon, Rasmuson and Pollock team campaign in Alaska.

GOP State Chairman Robert A. Davenny said, "News events which originate in either one of the six population centers can be transmitted quickly and simultaneously to all of the other sending and receiving stations. This will assure us of 100 per cent coverage on the campaign activities of our National team

candidates."

Davenny said the statewide teletype system is a "new approach" to political campaigning in Alaska. He said he hopes the teletype network can be tied in with Nixon's National headquarters within the next few days.

The Republican Chairman said he thinks the teletype system will eliminate the communications problem in the Party's Alaskan campaign.

The central control office for the new system is located in the campaign manager's office at 518 East 5th Avenue in Anchorage.

-Never leave small children alone, not even for a few minutes.

-If you need a baby sitter if you need one.

-Teach older children how to use and respect fire.

-Keep your home free of fire hazards by regular check-ups.

-Your fire department will help you.

-Have a home evacuation program and hold drills regularly.

-Don't overfuse your electrical system.

-Adopt safe smoking habits. Never smoke in bed.

-Have all the heating equipment in your home, including the chimney, cleaned and serviced.

-Practice good housekeeping. A well-kept home seldom burns.

"And," added Fire Marshal Dawson, "If nothing else matters, we want to be sure you are around next Fire Prevention Week."

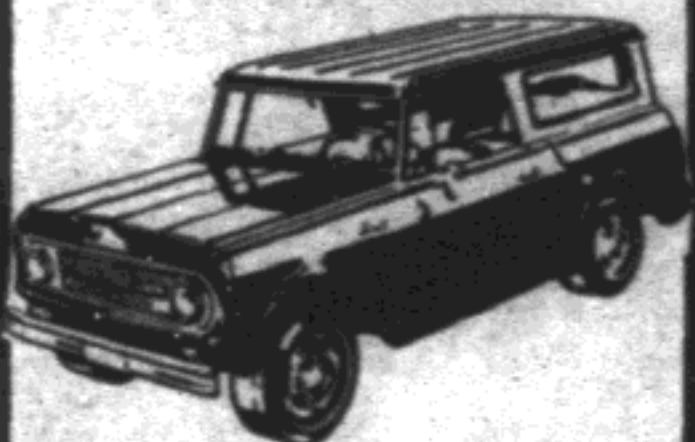
