Bill Asks 15-year Extension For State Land Selections

Alaska Senators E. L. Bartlett and Emest Gruening have nitroduced legislation (S3406) which will grant the state a 15-year extension on its authority to select mineral lands from the federal domain in the state.

The State's present authority to select mineral lands expires on January 3, 1969, ten years after statehood.

Initially, the authorization was given to the state for a five-year period, but was extended in 1964 because the five-year period was deemed insufficient.

The Interior Department has refused to process state land selections because of pending native land claims. Sen. Bartlett observed on introducing the measure that

"since there is no way of knowing how long it will take before the land claims are settled, it is only fair

Unfortunately, the House did not view this great need with such sympathy and refused to approve the money," he

On May 3, several weeks

after Senator Bartlett had appeared before the House subcommittee which considered the Native Housing appropriation, the full House Appropriations Committee reported favorably on the \$1 million to initiate the Alaska Housing Program which has been authorized for a total of \$10 million.

The next step along the legislative trail is consideration, and expected approval, of this measure by the House Representatives. This would clear the way for Senate action.
