This project consists of hot bituminous paving of 19 miles of the Richardson Highway, located approximately 80 miles southerly of Fairbanks, Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 49,000 tons of Hot Bituminous pavement; 85 tons of RC-800 Liquid Asphalt for Tack Coat; 2,000 linear feet of new beam type Guard Rail; 3,800 linear feet of removal and reconstruction of existing Guard Rail; and miscellaneous items of work.

SEALED bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment, and performing all work on Project ERFO-51(1) and F-031-2(22), Seward Highway Erosion Control and Safety Project, will be received until 2:00 p.m., prevailing time February 5, 1970 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project consists of furnishing and placing 255,000 tons of Rock Borrow Slope Protection and 29,000 linear feet of Beam Type Guard Rail. Also included will be the Removal and Disposal of 3,400 linear feet of existing guard rail. This project consists of grading and drainage of 2.9 miles of roadway, bituminous surface treatment of 0.2 miles of Bennett Street in Wrangell from the Zimovia Highway intersection to Second Avenue, and seal coating 6.6 miles of the Zimovia Highway from the Sawmill at mile 4.3 to and including the Wrangell Ferry Terminal in Wrangell, Alaska.
