

# Talented Natives to Get Scholarships from Hannah Memorial

The Muriel Hannah Memorial Scholarship in Art has been established at the University of Alaska, Anchorage to honor the artist who painted many Alaskan scenes and portraits.

Recipients of the scholarship will be selected on a competitive basis from Alaska native students at UAA with a demonstrated talent in art.

Miss Hannah's paintings of Eskimo children were used by Wien Consolidated Airlines for many years. Prints of the calendar paintings have been made available to the scholarship fund committee for public sale through the cooperation of Ray Peterson, president of Wien.

The proceeds from the sale of the prints will be part of the scholarship fund. Peterson

will donate a number of prints each year for five years.

The scholarship fund was initiated at the time of Miss Hannah's death in March of 1969. Alex Combs and Armond Kirschbaum have worked with Mrs. Dea Hartmen, the com-

mittee chairman, in selection and sale of the prints.

The committee has purchased other paintings from the estate and income from the sale of the paintings and prints will be added to the endowment fund annually.

An initial deposit of \$8,326.31 has now been placed in an endowment fund and only the revenue will be disbursed in scholarships. The first award will be made in fall of 1973.

Interested full-time native students should contact the financial aids office at UAA. Financial need will not be a factor unless there is a tie in the competition.



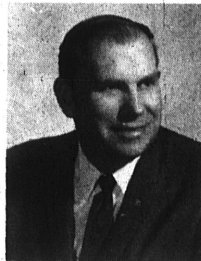
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## School Addition

JUNEAU — The state Department of Public Works has awarded a \$485,000 contract for construction of a school addition at Tok to A.C.E. General Contractors, Fairbanks, Governor Egan said.

The wood and steel-frame addition of 8,400 square feet will house a shop building, science laboratory and resource materials center. It is to be completed by the end of July, 1973.
