UA's 50th Anniversary - Six Students Attend Classes in '22

FAIRBANKS — Fifty years ago this week the University of Alaska — then called the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines — opened its doors for the first time.

On opening day, Sept. 18, 1922, the Fairbanks Daily News-Miner declared in its banner headline on page 1: "The World's Farthest North College Now Open."

There were just six students the first day. The News-Miner listed them as Roden Stewart Davis, Earl Hagen Foster, Donald Allen Morgan, Ethel Gert-rude Bailey, Arthur William Loftus, and John Hosler.

The weather was ideal "the atmosphere so clear that the tops of the mountains, snow-covered and beautiful, from the distance were able to lend their august presence to the opening . . ." reported the News-Miner.

Charles E. Bunnell, first president, "spoke briefly and to the point" to the students and faculty at opening ceremonies,

according to the newspaper.

The six faculty members were "all enthusiastic concerning the work they are undertaking with the opening of the college today." Among their number was Ernest N. Patty, a mining engineer who was to teach geology and mineralogy and who would become the university's third president in 1953.

The other original faculty members were Clinton H. Morgan, professor of agriculture and instructor in military science; Elizabeth E. Kirkpatrick, professor of home economics and English; Herbert D. Bruce, professor of chemistry and physics; Archie M. Truesdell, professor of mathematics and civil engineering; and Earl R. Pilgrim, professor of mining engineering and metallurgy.

Former President Woodrow Wilson sent along to the new college for its library a set of his monumental work, History of the American People, with Vol. I inscribed: "To the Alaska (Continued on page 10)

Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials and equipment, and performing all work on Project AL-071-2(16), Richardson Highway, Tazewell River, South 4-Miles described herein will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, October 26, 1972 in the Commissioners Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of grading, drainage and hot bituminous pavement on 4.1 miles of roadway and construction of a 469 foot composite girder bridge. The project is located approximately 4 miles south of Glennallen.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 59 acres of clearing and grubbing; 276,000 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 407,000 tons of selected material; 988,000 ton miles of haul; 1,400 cubic yards of structure excavation; 25,700 tons of D-1 base; 7,800 tons of hot asphalt pavement; 468 tons of 200-300 penetration asphalt cement and 64 tons of MC-30 liquid asphalt; 1,340 linear feet of pipe conduit ranging in size from 18" to 48"; 2,100 linear feet of 8" perforated pipe; 6,400 tons of class II riprap; 675,500 square feet of seeding; Hest area facilities consisting of pit toilets, tables, litter cans, fireplaces, shelter house, and water well with casting and hand pump; Painted traffic markings and telephone line adjustment, lump sum, all required; 910 cubic yards of Class I and Class II excavation for structures; approximately 890 cubic yards of Class A concrete, 178,000 pounds of reinforcing steel; and 632,000 pounds of structural steel, lump sum, all required; 246 cubic yards of Class 5 concrete; 2,500 linear feet of structural steel piles; 982 linear feet of metal bridge railing; and miscellaneous items of work.

All work shall be completed in 276 calendar days.
