SEALED BIDS in single copy for furnishing all labor, equipment, and materials and performing all work on Project S-0130(14) and S-0130(15), Nome City Streets and Nome-Teller Road Paving, described herein will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, March 13, 1969, in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project consists of grading, drainage, and paving of 0.62 miles of Nome City Streets and paving of 4.0 miles of the Nome-Teller Road between Nome and the Vocational School.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 34,000 cubic yards of crushed aggregate base; 12,000 tons of subbase, grading B; 8,000 tons of hot bituminous paving; 4,500 square yards of concrete sidewalk; 7,700 linear feet of type 2 curb and gutter; 60 linear feet of 12'-6" by 7'-11" Structural Plate Pipe-Arch; 3,000 linear feet of wood stave pipe, 6" and 8" diameter; and miscellaneous items of work.

All work shall be completed by August 1, 1970.
