UA Receives \$100,000 Scholarship Fund

A \$100,000 scholarship fund for Alaska students in financial need is being established at the University of Alaska in the name of Lt. Gen. Richard King Mellon, well-known eastern banker and philanthropist, Dr. William R. Wood, UA president, announced this week.

The gift by the Richard King Mellon Foundation of Pittsburgh, Pa. was made in response to a request for emergency aid for UA students living in flood-ravaged Interior Alaska last fall.

In a recent meeting of the foundation trustees, the decision for the scholarship grant was made.

"While we were sympathetic to the request for the emergency flood aid, it seemed that this would be but a temporary measure and that we should consider something more substantial," Joseph D. Hughes, administrative trustee for the foundation, wrote Elmer Rasmuson, chairman of UA's Board of Regents.

"The gift is being made to endow a scholarship fund in the name of General Mellon, who has long had great admiration for Alaska and its people."

In acknowledging the gift, Dr. Wood noted:

"The year just ending has been one of considerable adversity in the Interior of Alaska. General Mellon's gift to the university has done much to brighten our outlook."

"The gift is an investment in the young people of Alaska that will strengthen the development of the Great Land and its people."

A noted banker, civic leader and philanthropist, Gen. Mellon was a pilot in

the early days of military aviation and later, during World War II, served as assistant chief of staff in the International Division of the War Department.

He started his banking career as a messenger in the Mellon National Bank and ultimately became chairman of the board of the Mellon National Bank and Trust Co.

He has served as a director of many of America's leading corporations and is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Carnegie Institute of Technology in Pittsburgh.
