

**Girls to Play Men's Basketball Teams—**

**All American Red Heads to Play for New Hope Cottage**

The All American Red Heads, that famous girls basketball team playing only men's teams by men's rules, will be touring Alaska during the month of September and early October.

Starting out in Southeastern and working their way north, the Redheads will appear here in Anchorage at the West High Gym on the nights of September 17 and 18.

Their first game in Alaska will be at Metlakatla on the afternoon of Friday, September 10; then on to Ketchikan for a game that same evening. Saturday, September 11, they play in Wrangell at 1:00 p.m. and in Petersburg at 7:00 p.m., and on Sunday, September 12 fly on to Sitka for a game there at 2:00 p.m.

Two games will be played in Juneau, one on Sunday, September 12 at 8:00 p.m. and one on Monday, September 13 at the same time. Monday afternoon they will make a quick trip to Hoonah for a game there at 2 p.m.

From Juneau the Redheads will go on to appear in Haines on the night of September 14. Arriving at Yakutat on September 13, they will play a game that evening and on Thursday, September 16 will engage Cordova's hoopsters.

After appearing in Anchorage they fly to King Salmon via Petco Aviation charter, where they will play a game on the night of Sunday, September 19. Petco will fly them on to Dillingham on Monday, September 20, for a game at 1:00 p.m. and on to Bethel to play that same night at 8:00 p.m.

The small community of St. Mary's will see a game played on the night of Tuesday, September 21, and Unalakleet will see basketball on Wednesday, the 22nd.

From Unalakleet, Petco Charter will fly the Redheads on to Nome for two games, one on Thursday, September 23 and Friday, September 24.

Arriving in Kotzebue on Saturday, September 25, they will play that same day and will fly on to Barrow the next day to appear at 2:00 p.m. in that community.

Petco Aviation Charter then will fly the Redheads from Barrow to Fairbanks for two games in that city, on the nights of Monday, September 27 and Tuesday, September 28.

From Fairbanks they will take to the highway, going down the Richardson as far as Delta for a game at Fort Greely on Wednesday, September 29.

The Alaska Highway will be traveled on Thursday, September 30, to Tok, where they will have a game that night, then down the Glenn Highway to Glennallen to appear on the night of Friday, October 1.

Saturday, October 2, will place them in Valdez to play at 7:00 p.m. and on Sunday, October 3, the Redheads return to Anchorage and drive up the highway to Palmer for a basketball

game that night.

The community of Talkeetna will enjoy the Redheads spectacular basketball on the night of Monday, October 4.

The Redheads first game on the Kenai Peninsula will be in Seward on the night of Tuesday, October 5. The Kenai High-school will be the site of their game on October 6, and they drive on to Homer to play on Thursday, October 7.

The Redheads last game before they leave Alaska and return to Caraway, Arkansas, their home station, will be played in Kodiak on the night of Friday, October 8.

This is not the first time this sparkling all girl's team has played in Alaska, and everywhere they thrilled basketball fans of all ages. Wherever the Redheads play they exemplify first class basketball, plus pro-

viding excellent entertainment with their merriment and hilarity.

In Anchorage they will appear against the Boy's Club Graduates on Friday, September 17, and the College Preps on Saturday, September 18.

Proceeds from these games are to go toward the new Hope Cottage facility for the severely retarded children from all over Alaska.
