



per dog) in areas where dogs are economically important, and veterinary service is not avail available.

It is required that some quali fied individual be in charge, fo handling vaccines requires cer tain precautions.

In communities where rabie is a threat, and the individual are unable to afford protection the Department may be able to assist.

SUGGESTED PROGRAM FOR ISOLATED COMMUNITIES CAMPS

1. confine all dogs and eliminate strays.

2. Vaccinate all animals. Immunity lasts up to three years depending on the type of vaccine.

3. Eliminate foxes and wolves in the area where rabies has been found.

4. Confine for observation biting dogs or those showing any rabies symptoms.

5. Submit heads, of those animals who show definite symptoms, for positive identification.

6. Use caution in skinning or handling suspect animals to prevent accidental exposure.

7. Seek medical aid immediately when bitten if the animal shows symptoms.
