This project consists of raising the superstructure on the north abutment, regrading the north approach and miscellaneous guard rail and hazard marker construction. 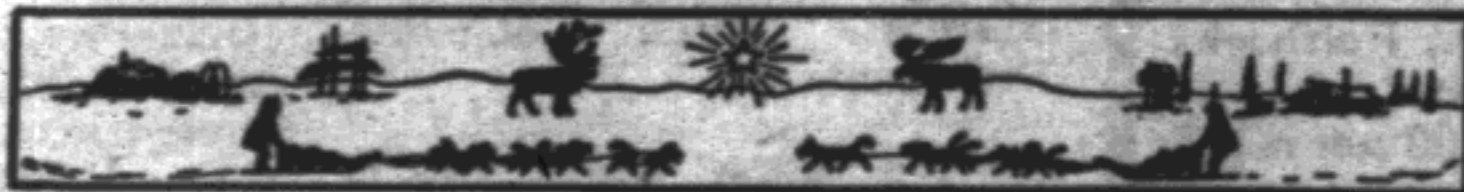
