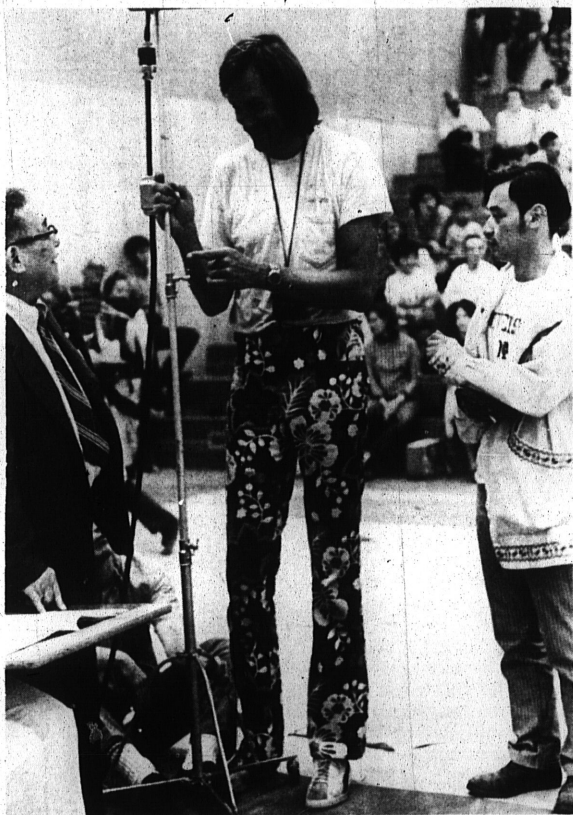


ONE EYED VIEW—Robert Heffley, third place winner in the Baby Contest, got a little "hood-

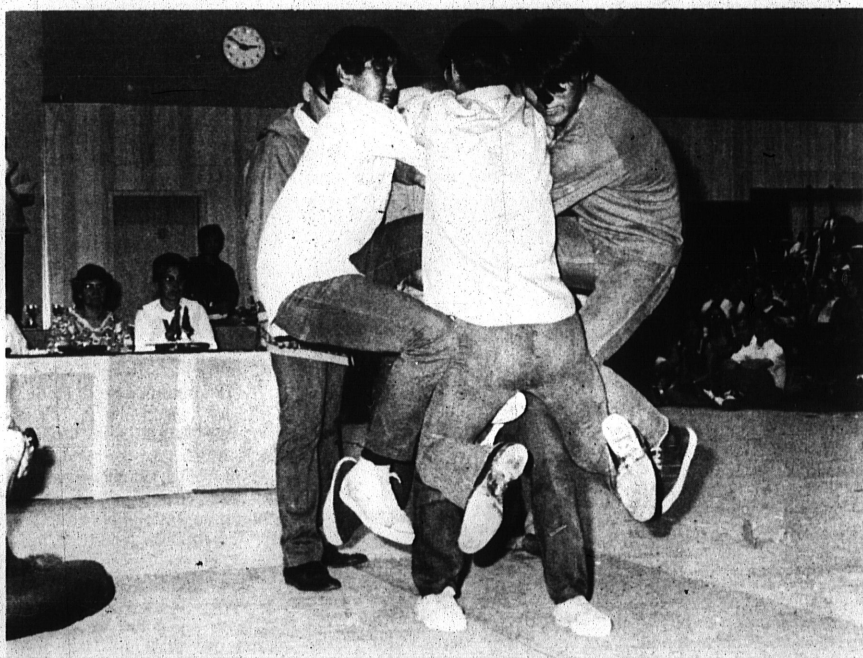
winked" but enjoyed the Olympics anyway.

## Claims Backing

LAWTON, OKLA.—Alaska land claims legislation gained backing from the newly organized North American Indian Women's Assn. at the organization's first national conference.

The women back a settlement of 60 million acres, two per cent overriding royalty in oil and gas revenue, \$500 million federal appropriation, active regional native corporations and return to villages of land selected by the Bureau of Land Management under tentative approval.

Mrs. James M. Cox, Comanche Tribe of Oklahoma, is national president. Attending from Fairbanks was Mrs. Mary Jane Fate.
