

Haw appointed project director of ANHRD program

FAIRBANKS—William T. Haw, former director of special services at Flathead Valley Community College in Kalispell, Mont., has been appointed project director of the Alaska Native Human Resources Development Program.

The program, administered by the University of Alaska, was established in 1973 with a five-year \$681,461 grant from the W. K. Kellogg Foundation. Haw's appointment as its director, announced by Dr. Robert W. Hiatt, president of the university, is effective June 21.

Primary purpose of the program is to promote the training and development of native leadership through a broadening of pertinent university operations.

In his new position, Haw will establish and evaluate innovative pilot programs aimed at

enhancing higher education in rural Alaska.

Educational techniques developed which prove to be of significant value are expected to be incorporated into such existing university programs as Rural Educational Affairs and the Cooperative Extension Service.

At Flathead Valley Community College, Haw was instrumental in developing vocational and academic offerings relevant to Indian tribes and integrating them into the college system. Earlier he was director of a community free school for Blackfeet Indians and guidance counselor for Browning, Mont. public schools.

Haw currently is completing work for a doctorate in guidance and counseling at Wayne State University.

"We are pleased to have been able to select a candidate who

has demonstrated high leadership abilities and imaginative approaches to

pressing educational needs of American Indians," said Hiatt. "These should prove of great value in his new position."
