

## Zaye Chapin Appointed Head of Psychology-Sociology Dept. at UA

Zaye Chapin, assistant professor of sociology at the University of Alaska, has been named head of the university's Psychology and Sociology Department, and Dr. Dwane J. Sykes has been named to head the UA's Department of Land Resources and Agricultural Science.

The appointments were announced this week by Dr. William R. Wood, university president.

Miss Chapin succeeds Dr. Frank Q. Sessions, who accepted a position with

Central Washington State College this year. She has been with the university since 1966 and came to Alaska from the Los Angeles County Bureau of Public Assistance where she was a training supervisor.

Dr. Sykes, who is expected to take up his post at the end of this month, is new to the university. He has been associated with Purdue University, working with a Purdue-sponsored technical assistance project at the University of Minas Gerais in Brazil.

Dean Arthur Buswell of UA's Division of Statewide Services has been acting head of the Land Resources and Agriculture Department.

## Anchorage Social Security Office to Be Converted

Robert M. Ball, Commissioner of Social Security, has announced in Washington that the Social Security Administration branch office in Anchorage, Alaska, will be converted to a district office in the near future.

The branch office in Anchorage is presently supervised by the district office in Juneau. When the conversion takes place, the

office in Anchorage will become an independent operation, receiving direction from a regional office in San Francisco as does the office in Juneau.

The office provides social security service to approximately 220,000 persons residing in the Interior, Northwest, Southcentral, and Southwest sections of the State.

The office is staffed to handle inquiries about medicare as well as to help people apply for social security cash benefits.

It also issues social security cards, and in general provides a wide range of social security services to the people of the area.

The office in Anchorage is located at 617 "G" Street.

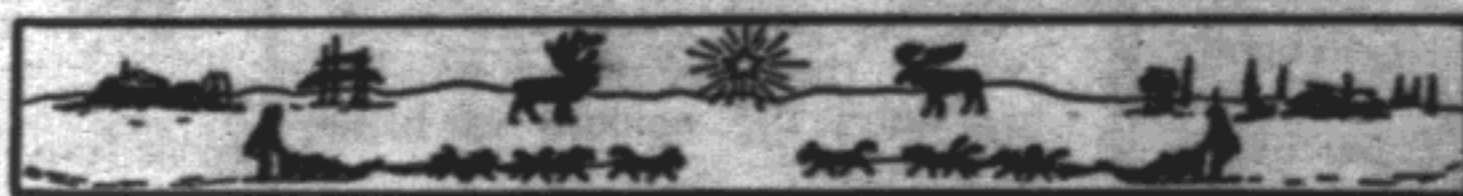

#### INVITATION FOR BIDS STATE OF ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS

Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, material, and equipment and performing all work for Project F-095-2(4) and S-0920(4), Ketchikan Ferry Terminal Paving and Whipple Creek to Forest Boundary, described herein will be received until 11:00 a.m. PST., October 31, 1967, in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project consists of grading, drainage, and paving of 3.9 miles of the Tongass Highway, construction of a composite steel and concrete bridge and paving the Ketchikan Ferry Terminal. All work is located northerly of the city of Ketchikan, Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 28 acres of clearing and grubbing; 253,000 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 18,400 cubic yards of selected material; 23,400 tons of crushed base and 28,600 tons of subbase materials; 5,200 tons of bituminous plant mixture; 4,900 linear feet of pipe conduit ranging in size from 8" to 54" diameter; 338 cubic yards of Class A Concrete; 57,500 pounds of reinforcing steel; 96,000 pounds of structural steel; and miscellaneous roadway and bridge items. All work shall be completed by August 15, 1969.
