WATERFOWL HUNTING season opens today, Sept. 1, with limits on game ducks a day with a three-day possession limit of 21. Bag limits on non-game ducks and geese will remain unchanged from last year. Fish and Game says statewide 4 duck and good oppulations are moderate but are predicting an excellent hunting season if fall weather holds. The season will close. Dec. 16 for most of the state.

A REPRIEVE FOR IMMIGRANT Duncan Pryde, 39, author of the bestselling "Nunaga" and presently director of Barrow's Council on Alcoholism, has been granted by the U.S. Immigration Service. He was originally ordered to leave the U.S. by Aug. 15 because he had failed to obtain the proper visa. Pryde maintained that there had been some confusion about the visa application with his employer, Inupiat University, where he was hired to teach the Inupiat language. His deadline has now been extended to Sept. 15. Pryde, a Scotsman by birth, is thought to be the only white man able to converse with North Slope Eskimos in their own language.

SUCCESSFUL MOOSE hunters are being asked to help out Fish and Game by bringing in the antlers and lower jaw of the animals they catch. Game biologists are trying to learn more about the average size and shape of yearling moose antlers and are asking particularly for small antlers with spreads of less than 40 inches.
