Alaska Seen as Linkage Of Cultures for Goals

COLLEGE-Alaska may be one of the last areas in the United States where cultural groups can join together to strive toward common goals, asserted Elmer Rasmuson, Chairman, Board of Regents, University of Alaska, speaking at the concluding banquet for the Alaska Cooperative Service Staff, Extension 4-H and Youth Conference, March 13.

Mr. Rasmuson also stressed that developing the worthiness of an individual is a vital aspect of youth programs.

Reverend Eugene Walters, First Methodist Church, Anchorage, opening speaker at the conference discussed youth sub-culture. He stated that today's youth are facing the same issues as yesterday's youth only they are in different "clothing." These sex, rebellion, include · and identity. fre edon.

Reverend Walters also discussed increasing amounts of leisure time young people will be having in the future the importance opportunities to make constructive use of such time.


