Eskimo Ben Ungudruk, 19, of Anchorage has spent the summer on the Alaska-British Columbia border discouraging job seekers from the South '48. That may sound contrary to the friendly tradition of his people but the Alaska Methodist University student was actually performing a much needed service. Jobs are scarce here and it's better for outsiders to learn it at the border than at the food stamp office in Fairbanks.

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For Flood Recovery—Pledges \$20,000 to Galena

JUNEAU—Governor William A. Egan announced today that the state of Alaska has pledged a total of \$20,000 toward flood recovery funds for the Yukon River community of Galena. The total financial assistance for the flood-stricken community from state, federal, and other agencies is \$238,000. Governor Egan pledged the \$20,000 from Rural Development Agency funds, consisting of \$10,000 as a direct grant and a labor grant of \$10,000 from Operation Mainstream funds. The direct grant is from state funds while the Operation Mainstream grant is from a federal-state program sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor. The Bureau of Indian Affairs has authorized \$170,000 for the

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rehabilitation of homes, household furnishings, materials, and labor for the improvement of housing at the present Galena townsite.
