

Four Legislators at Conference—

Retired Group Draws Groh, Hensley, Banfield, Fisher

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Four state legislators from Alaska will participate in a unique national conference on the problems of older persons to be sponsored by the American Association of Retired Persons and National Retired Teachers Association Dec. 4-6 in Washing-

ton, D.C. State Senators Clifford J. Groh and Willie Hensley, both of Anchorage, and Representatives Mildred Banfield of Juneau and Helen M. Fisher of Anchorage have been selected to participate in the 1972 National Forum of State Legislators on Older Americans.

Also attending the three-day meeting will be Vernon L. Perry, Acting Coordinator of the Alaska Office on Aging.

The conference will help identify specific problems of older Americans in the areas of income, housing, health care and transportation which can be solved through state and community action and alert legislators to programs which have been successfully implemented in other states.

Major speakers at the conference will be Dr. Arthur S. Flemming, Special Consultant to President on Aging; U.S. Senator Jennings Randolph (D-W.Va.), chairman of the Employment and Retirement Income Subcommittee of the Senate Special Committee on Aging;

U.S. Commissioner on Aging John Martin; political analyst and former Census Bureau Director Richard M. Scammon; and noted research psychiatrist and gerontologist Dr. Robert M. Butler.

The meeting will be sponsored in cooperation with the White House Conference on Aging, Administration on Aging, and National Legislative Conference.

This project will consist of grading, drainage and hot bituminous paving on 1.25 miles of roadway near Wasilla, Alaska. Included in the work will be relocation of 3,600 linear feet of railroad track.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 136,000 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 13,300 tons of crushed aggregate base; 13,000 tons of subbase A; 3,700 tons of hot asphalt pavement; 225 tons of 200-300 pen asphalt cement, 33 tons of MC-30 liquid asphalt, and 14 tons of CSS-1 emulsified asphalt; 15,000 tons of Class 1 riprap; 246 square feet of standard signs; 701,000 square feet of seeding and furnishing and planting 45 trees; Railroad track work, and highway lighting system, lump sum, all required; and miscellaneous items of work.
