Esther Garber served recently on the Urban Native Center Task Force as a coordinator in the Greater Anchorage area. Esther is from Tyonek and has been an active member of the Tyonek Tribe, the Cook Inlet Native Association, and the Alaska Federation of Natives.

She is a graduate of the Mt. Edgecumbe High School out of Sitka. She recently received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration and Economics from Alaska Methodist University.

Esther's son Bart attends East Anchorage High and her daughter Janeel attends Wendler Junior High School.

TO ALL NATIVES 1/4 or more in blood, in order to receive benefits from the Alaskan Native Lands Claims Act, everyone must be enrolled. Beginning on Monday, April 3, our enumerators will be in the field in the Cook Inlet Region. They will have identification and are responsible for the enrollment of all natives, either real children or adopted; therefore, don't be insulted if you are asked questions by our enumerators. If there is no one in your house who is qualified, please tell the enumerator, so he can go to the next house as our time is limited.
