Lots and lots of vegetable-like sea foods come ashore and tom cods sometimes come in piles along the shore. Those tom cods are good for food and

for dog food, too.

Sometimes we do not know what to do with them, when they come so thick, that we

wish some was given to the places where food shortage is a problem, like over at China or India.

But this fall, we ran to the mountain in fear of tidal wave that might have come at the blast at Amchitka, but to our great relief, it did not come. Every one was relieved, after the blast, as it was, too the temperature was down to freezing. Many snow machines made a way to the camps other machines side of the mountain.

Freezing and slipperyness are main problems this time of the year for us, it rains so much in the fall, too.

A few days ago, there was a snow storm. It blew so high it

was blowing as high as the tops of the houses, so that now we have snow as deep as three feet in places. And the lake is all ice now, so that snow machines can go on the ice.

There are only two or three one teams here, although there are many many dogs. Everyone prefers snow machines. And, like many other ambitions, the best dog team belong to a white man, here. Eskimos are so eager with their snow machines they enjoy traveling fast with bright lights lighting their way.

Although we are not too comfortable with some of white people's ways we enjoy electric lights greatly. Our whole fourth

All lands north of the 68th North Latitude from the state's westernmost boundary to 146 West Longitude north along the 146 West Longitude to 68 degrees 30 minutes North Latitude east to the Canada/United States Border, then north to the limits of the State of Alatica's northern boundary, thence mendering westerly to the point of beginning. This territory comprises generally the entire region known as the Arctic Slope, including the Brooks Range and its drainage to the north;
