Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment and performing all work on Project RF-0005(4), Glenn Highway Guardrail described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, December 9, 1971 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of guardrail construction at various locations along the Glenn Highway between M.P. 49 and M.P. 118.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 10,600 cubic yards Subbase, Grading B; 11,261 linear feet of Removal and Disposal of existing Guardrail; 25,962 linear feet of new Beam Type Guardrail; 32 Guardrail Bridge Anchorage and 54 Type 1A Posts; Removal of existing Bridge Railing and Curbs, lump sum, all required; 482 linear feet of Steel Beam Bridge Railing; and miscellaneous items of work.

All work shall be completed in 120 Calendar days.

Crash Kills Four

Four persons from Kotzebue and Noorvik died early Sunday when a single engine plane crashed and burned on takeoff from the Kotzebue Municipal Airport.

The Cessna 180 was bound for Noorvik when the accident took place.

Victims were identified as William Rember, the pilot, an employee of the Federal Aviation Administration at Kotzebue; Wilfred Zibell, a Bible translator who had been living at Noorvik, Emory Harris, an employee of the B & R Tug and Barge, Inc. in Kotzebue; and Winfred Tiepelman, student body president of the Kotzebue Day School.

Wilfred Zibell, a linguist missionary who came to the Kotzebue area in 1959, is best known for his work on the first Inupiat dictionary which grew out of the activities of the Wy-

cliffe Bible Translators, Inc. Summer Institute of Linguistics. The dictionary was published for the Rural Alaska School Project.

Besides working on a complete Bible translation for the Kotzebue Sound Area, Zibell taught literacy classes and worked on further Eskimo language teaching materials. His work is considered a basis for any bilingual teaching program in the Kotzebue area.

Hunters Need Not Be Lost

"We spend thousands of man-hours and dollars every year on seeking lost hunters during the hunting season. Much of the time and energy spent on such searches could be avoided if hunters would take the time to let their neighbors, our State Troopers, or the Coast Guard know where they plan to hunt and when they expect to be back," Commissioner of Public Safety Emery Chapple said today in looking toward the Thanksgiving holidays.

The Commissioner pointed out that in one period during last year's hunting season, 85

hunters were reported overdue or lost in Southeast alone without counting statistics from other parts of the State.

Additional information which can be filed are radio call letters, number in the hunting party, type of boat used, area of cruising, and time of departure.

"It only takes a minute to advise us by phone where you intend to go," concluded Commissioner Chapple. "Do that and much anxiety can be avoided by both our department and relatives of the hunters."
