# University of Alaska Winter Carnival Starts Today

It's that time of year when one is HAPPY for all the snow and ice and cold clear days. It's winter carnival time at the University of Alaska!

Everybody in town is invited to lay aside their showshovels and come to the campus for games, entertainment, and fun.

The carnival officially begins at noon on Friday, Feb 3 when student groups may begin to hack away at blocks of ice and transform them into sculptured artpieces.

On Tuesday, February 7, a treasure hunt will begin with clues given over local radio stations. There will be snowshoe softball, broom hockey, an art exhibit will open, and the Alaska Air Command band will entertain.

Wednesday will bring a tug of war, broom hockey, Walt Disney's "White Wilderness," a water ballet, and a fashion show.

Those who have never tried the Eskimo blanket toss will get their chance

on Thursday, or they can compete in cross country skiing, slalom races, and broom hockey, and then climax it with the fabulous Glenn Yarbrough Concert that evening in the Patty Gymnasium.

Friday brings skating competitions, the "Ramblin' Five Folksingers," and the first of two games between the Nanooks and Central Washington State.

Saturday is the BIG day beginning with the Winter Carnival Parade through the campus and followed by snow mobile competition, sky diving competition, and a rifle match. Kids under 11 can enter their dog and sled in the "Mutt Race" and might take home a trophy.

The week is climaxed with the Nanooks second game with Washington and with the beautiful Snow Ball Formal. All trophies will be awarded at the Ball which will be held in the University Commons and feature music by 9th Army band.

People not wearing brightly colored buttons on their lapels will miss out on all the fun. The button admits the wearer to most of the events and may be purchased for the moderate price of \$2.00.

Some of the contests are limited to the U of A full time students, others to dorm and student groups, and some are open to anybody interested.

The Glenn Yarbrough concert will require a \$1.50 ticket in addition to the button. Tickets and buttons may be purchased at Pan Alaska and the Music Shop, or at the University book store. Detailed programs of the weeks activities may be picked up at the book store or the student activities office.

## Village Paper Reaches Far

CHALKYITSIK, (Special)—What started out as a newspaper primarily for Chalkyitsik has turned into a major enterprise.

When the newspaper first started, most of the issues were sold in the village. Now, just six months later, a large number of issues are sent out of the village each week.

At this writing, 58 papers weekly leave the village for all parts of the world. Many of the subscriptions come from friends of the people who live in Chalkyitsik.

Others saw articles, or ads, in Tundra Times or The Daily News-Miner. Still others heard about the newspaper and the project by word of mouth; notably in Michigan where Dr. DeLong, who taught in Alaska last summer, told his friends about us.

Many of the subscribers not only want to hear about Chalkyitsik, but also want to help the project to send the children to Fairbanks this spring.

A rundown by state of our subscribers goes like this: Alaska, 26; California, 4; Colorado, 1; Michigan, 5; Montana, 3; New York, 11; Pennsylvania, 1; Washington 1; and Washington, D.C., 1.

We also send a newspaper to Puerto Rico, one to Paris, France, and one to Argentina in South America.

We would like to take this time to thank all our subscribers and readers for their support and to hope that they will continue to enjoy the paper.
