The Alaska National Guard is now accepting enlistments by registrants who have received notice of induction. The change in procedures was announced earlier this month by Selective Service officials in Washington.

Prior to July 1, men who had received notice of induction from their local selective service boards were ineligible for enlistment in the Army or Air National Guard.

The enlistment in the Guard must be completed at least ten days prior to the date of induction.

Full details on the program are available from Army and Air National Guard recruiters throughout the State, and from local selective service offices.

In compliance with Title 23, U.S.C., The Department of Highways has received from the Federal Highway Administration location and design approval on a spur of Federal-aid Secondary Route 0680 between the Elliott Highway and the village of Minto, Alaska. The proposed improvement will begin at a point on the Elliott Highway approximately 200 feet east of the Huttitakwa Creek bridge. From that point it extends generally southerly approximately four miles, thence following the existing road generally southeasterly, crosses Uncle Sam creek, passes south of the Minto airstrip, passes through the village of Minto on a platted street and terminate near the boat landing at the Tolovana River. The proposed improvement will consist of a 28 foot wide roadway with crushed aggregate surface. Graveled sidewalks having a width of five feet will be constructed on both sides of the roadway through the village of Minto. Total length of the improvement is 11.2 miles. There will be no access control except as provided in the Alaska Administrative Code as it pertains to driveways. Preliminary maps and drawings and Negative Declaration are available for public inspection at the Department of Highways District Engineer's Office, 2301 Pegar Road, Fairbanks, Alaska.

Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials and equipment, and performing all work on Project BRF-ALF-037-2(19), Anchorage-Fairbanks Highway, Cantwell to McKinley Park described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, August 17, 1972 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of grading and drainage of 21.23 miles of roadway, construction of a 77' composite steel girder bridge with a roadway width of 44' across Carlo Creek, and construction of a 358' composite steel girder bridge with a roadway width of 34' across the Nenana River at McKinley Park boundary.

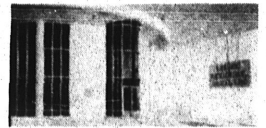
Principal items of work consist of the following: 310 acres of Clearing and Grubbing; 1,480,000 cubic yards of Unclassified Excavation; 839,000 tons of Borrow; 200,500 tons of Subbase, Grading C; 7,274 linear feet of Pipe Conduit for culverts, 18" thru 72"; 18,675 linear feet of Beam Type Guard Rail; 89,650 tons of Riprap, Class II; Class A concrete, Lump Sum, all required; Structural Steel, lump sum, all required.

All work shall be completed in 368 Calendar days.
