## Pressure Vessel Engineers to Give Free Course

JUNEAU — Pressure vessel engineers from the Department of Labor will conduct free training courses for boiler and heating plant operators during the coming months.

The courses will emphasize safe operation of boilers and heating plants in schools, public buildings, refineries and private businesses.
