H.R. 14582 Supplemental Appropriations Bill Passes by Record Vote

Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials and equipment, and performing all work on Project S-0680 (21), Chatanika River to Snowshoe Pass described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, June 8, 1972 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

Wednesday, May 16, to accept the conference report on H.R. 14582, making supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year 1972.

Congressman Begich voted for the supplemental appropriations bill, which passed by a record vote of 339 yeas to 33 nays.

A total of \$1,308,000 was appropriated to prepare census rolls of Indians and Alaskan Natives, and to assist them in land selection as provided in the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act.

The House bill had proposed an appropriation of \$300,000 for the "Joint Federal-State Land Use Planning Commission for Alaska", while the Senate had proposed \$125,000. The Conference Committee accepted the Senate version in its report.

The original House version of the bill appropriated a budget estimate of \$12,500,000 for immediate distribution among the Regional Corporations for the benefit of Alaskan natives.

The original Senate version authorized the advance of \$500,000 to each Regional Corpora-

tion for a total of \$6,000,000 with the additional \$6,500,000 to be retained in the Alaskan Native Fund to draw interest.

The Senate version was adopted by the Conference Committee in its report.
