

Nick Gray Memorial Scholarship Established by CINA

In honor of the founder of the Cook Inlet Native Association, a scholarship fund has been appropriated as the Nick Grey Memorial Scholarship Fund.

Appropriation of \$2,000.00 will be divided into four \$500.00 scholarships.

The Scholarships will be made available to three educational levels. One, high school graduates entering college; two, upper division college students; three,

the graduate level student.

The high school student scholarships will be divided into two \$500.00 amounts to be used as seed money for matching funds from the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Economic Opportunity monies.

It is anticipated that each scholarship could total approximately \$3,000.00 with the matching funds added.

The other two categories, the

upper division and graduate level student will each amount to two \$250.00 grants.

The scholarships will be implemented by mid-May, 1972, and the applicants chosen will be based upon ability and need.

All applicants will be selected from the Cook Inlet Region on a competitive basis. Interested students may obtain more information from Mr. Robert Rude, President, CINA, at 274-4633.

Miss Feldkirchner first came to Alaska with BIA in 1947. During her almost 25 years here she has taught approximately 1150 Native students in the villages of White Mountain, Noatak, Ft. Yukon, Tanana, Pt Barrow and Unalakleet.

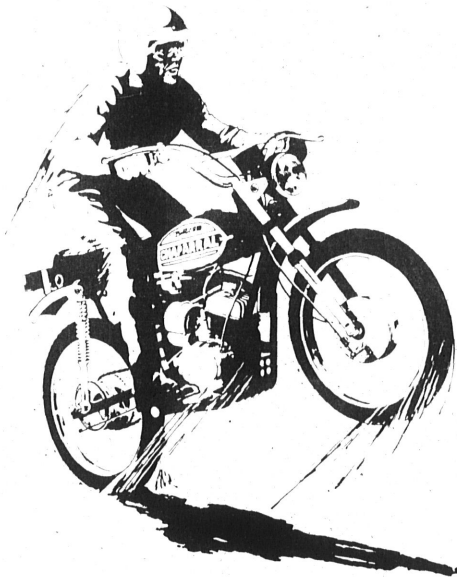

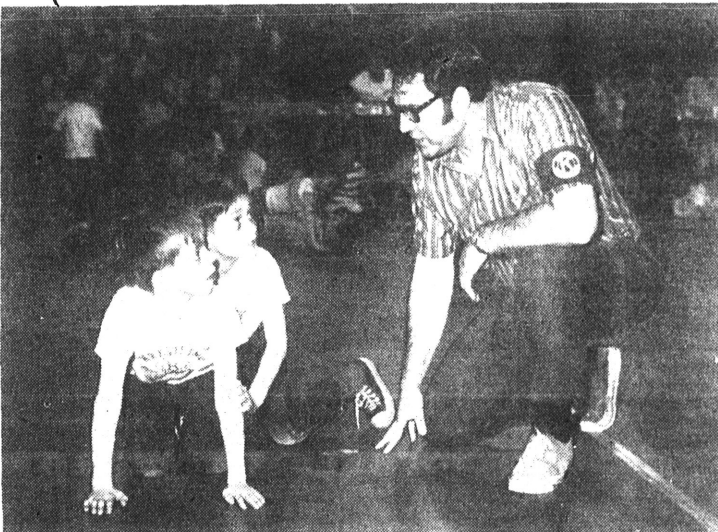
