

NATIONAL PARK SYSTEM


NATIONAL PARK: Nadional Park Service (NPS) management; no hunting & trapping; fishing allowed; no new mineral entry; limited access; no logging; no domestic grazing; closed to State selection.




NATIONAL PRESERVE: NPS management; hunting, trapping & fishing under Alaska Department of Fish & Game (ADF&G) regulations; no mineral entry; limited access; no logging; no domestic grazing; closed to State selection.




NATIONAL RECREATION AREA: NPS management; hunting, fishing, trapping, logging and other compatible uses could be permitted; access strictly controlled; closed to State selection.



NATIONAL WILDLIFE RANGES AND REFUGES: Fish and Wildlife Service (F&WS) management; hunting, trapping & fishing permitted under ADF&G regulations: mining, logging, grazing and other compatible uses may be permitted under regulation of F&WS: access closely regulated; closed to State selection.



NATIONAL FORESTS: Forest Service management; hunting, fishing & trapping under ADF&G regulations; mining, logging, grazing and other "multiple uses" permitted; closed to State selections.



ALASKA RESOURCE LANDS (ARL): Federal lands where the prime uses and management agency would be designated by Congress; classification authority by the Alaska Land Commission. Open to mining, logging, grazing and other compatible uses; open to hunting, trapping & fishing under ADF&G regulations.



COOPERATIVE MANAGEMENT AREAS (COMANS):
Areas in which the Alaska Land Commission has classification jurisdiction over Federal lands. Classification authority by the Commission over State lands would require separate State enabling legislation. Participation of private landowners is voluntary. State selections precluded pending Commission classification for such purpose. No uses specifically excluded.

SPECIAL STUDY AREAS: Alaska Resource Lands which have been identified as possessing unusually high natural value. The Commission will be directed to complete studies for these areas to determine whether or not they require special classifications.
