Grants amounting to almost \$13 million have been awarded under the Educational Broad-casting Facilities Program (EBFP) to help establish or improve 73 noncommercial public radio and television stations in 34 states and the District of Columbia, HEW's Office of Education

Six of these grants will aid in the establishment of new tele-vision stations; 37 will be used to give color capability and otherwise improve stations already on the air.

A total of 30 grants have been made. Nine grantees will use their funds to establish new stations and 21 to improve their
