

Hunter Sees Wanton Destruction by Vandals with Magnum .12

Ed Hall rose early Wednesday morning, Oct. 4, and drove to Blind Slough for some daybreak bird-shooting.

"I stopped at Blind Island first to see if any geese were lying in there," he says.

While walking the trail to the water he passed four Forest Service garbage cans that had been "worked over" by .12 and .410-gauge shotguns.

"The cans were all shot up,"

he stated, "and expended three-inch magnum .12 gauge and .410 shells were scattered around."

Hall walked farther toward the slough and found two freshly killed blue herons lying where they'd been shot, with more of the three-inch magnum .12-gauge ammunition nearby.

"There weren't any birds at Blind Island," Hall explained, "so I drove to Blind River Rapids."

"The sign at the rapids was blown in half and five spent .12-gauge cartridges were lying on the ground nearby," he continued.

Hall suggested that the person wielding the shotgun had removed the plug to accommodate five shells.

"I walked down the trail and found three small trees shot-gunned down," continues Hall. He added that a Tongass Na-

tional Forest sign also had been shot up.

Returning to town, about midway between Papke's Landing and Blind Slough, Hall found several more small trees, three or four inches in diameter, blown down by shotgun fire.

The hunter described the destruction as a "pretty sad state of affairs."

He suggested that the shooting occurred the previous day

as the birds were killed recently and the expended shells were new.

Hall said he would notify the State Trooper.

Human Rights Commissioners Reject Request

ANCHORAGE — Robert Willard, the Executive Director of the State Human Rights Commission recently announced that the agency's seven-member board of Commissioners rejected the Department of Health and Social Services' request for reconsideration of an age discrimination case.

The board met in Juneau on October 12 and 13 and in making the decision served notice on the Department in a letter to Commissioner Frederick P. McGinnis signed by five of the seven members.

The director released a copy of the Commissioner's letter to McGinnis which states in part:

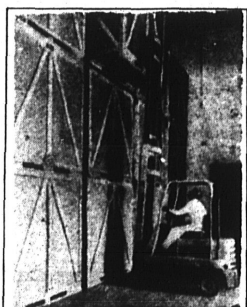
"The petition for reconsideration in the matter of Bessie G. Stevens vs. MacLaughlin Youth Center is hereby denied. Procedurally, the Commission is governed by the Alaska Administrative code which provides discretionary authority to reopen the matter properly before the Board of Commissioners. . . the issued raised in the petition incapably warrant reopening the proceedings in this matter."

The Hearing Commissioners "instructed the department to take appropriate compliance with the order within fifteen days before proceeding with legal action to enforce the Commission's Order".

Willard remained in Juneau for the week on annual leave in hopes of "being there when Congressman (Nick) Begich comes walking home".
